6. **Canada:** From **Markus and Regine Gommel**, “Please pray that our Isa Fellowship friends will sign up for our summer camp in Moffat from July 24-27th. It is so important that they hear from the word of God and be in fellowship with believers.”

8. **Bangladesh:** The Bengalis are one of the largest unreached people in the world. There are many missionary opportunities, but there is a lack of workers. Please pray that God will call people and that the small team will receive reinforcements.”

9. **Canada: Tobias and Sarah Müller** write, “Please pray for our neighborhood soccer league with about 200 kids registered. During halftime there will be a short gospel message. Many of the children do not know the God of the Bible or the salvation found in Jesus Christ. Please pray for open hearts, attentive ears, and that God would draw many to Himself through His Word.”

10. **Spain: Theo and Carolin Hertler** live in a social hotspot of Torremolinos. They are involved in church development work. Some people drop by repeatedly. Some find connections via the internet, and by invitations. Homeless people drop by often. Please pray that these individuals will have encounters with Jesus and be free.

11. **Malawi: Stefan and Debora Müller** are a part of a team doing media ministry among the Yao, an ethnic group in southern Malawi. Please pray that their films are viewed and that people encounter Jesus through them.

12. **Papua New Guinea:** Christian communities play a crucial role in the support of young people. In collaboration with the government, **Manuel Feige** developed a character training program. Local trainers have already been trained in five sessions, each having 70-100 participants. They currently are reaching out to young people and their churches. There are plans to offer the training in secondary schools. Please pray for the openness to integrate this into the school curriculum.

13. **Canada: Anne and Sam Strauss** will be helping in the mornings of July 13-17 as leaders at their church’s Vacation Bible School (VBS). Please pray for children attending from the neighbourhood, that they have a fun and safe time, build friendships and can make an informed decision for Jesus.

14. **Japan: Maximilian and Sybille Seifert** report, “Looking toward our future, several pastors have asked us if we could help plant a church. However, a specific location in Tokyo is particularly close to our hearts. This area has more than 200,000 residents, and there is no Japanese church. It has little traditional religious influence. Please pray for God’s guidance that we will go where He wants us to be.”

15. **Germany: Aaron and Ilonka Köpke** write, “Thank you for praying for the church plant in Rostock! We’ve seen how God paves the way and opens doors: at neighborhood meetings, in clubs, and at the daycare. Ilonka has many conversations about God with her colleagues at the daycare. They are interested in attending our Family Church service. Please pray that we will introduce people here to Jesus in creative and loving ways.”
